1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Three-quarters of respondents in Germany consider climate change to be a 'very serious' problem (75%, EU average 74%). Nearly one in seven see it as the most serious problem facing the world (14%, EU average 12%), although this is a 12 percentage point fall since the previous survey in 2015.

Nearly two-thirds say they have taken personal action to fight climate change in the past six months (65%, EU average 49%). However, when given specific examples this rises to 93% (EU average 90%), suggesting many do not associate certain actions with tackling climate change.

- Over three-quarters of those surveyed in Germany try to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling (77%, EU average 71%).

- Around seven in ten (71%) try to cut down on consumption of disposable items whenever possible, significantly above the EU average (56%).

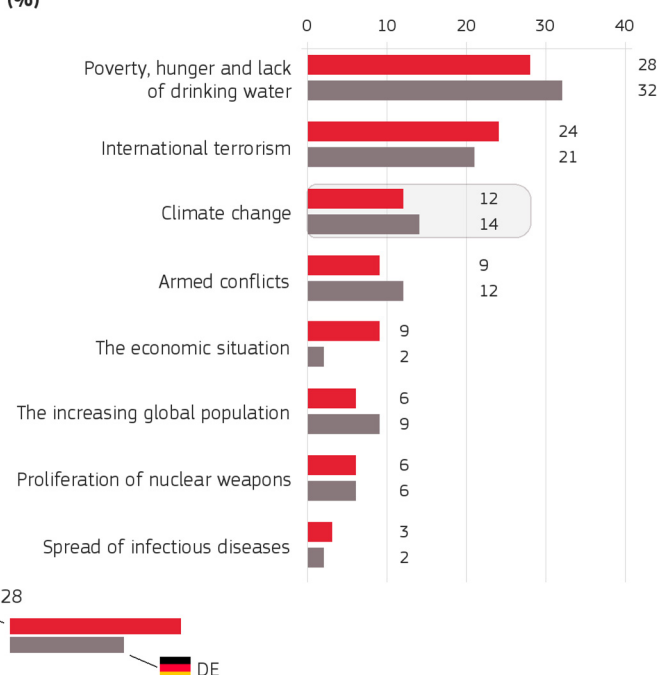
- The proportion taking lower energy consumption into account when buying a new household appliance has decreased by 10 pp since 2015 to just over four in ten (43%), but this is still above the EU average (37%).

Respondents in Germany are more likely than the EU average to agree that promoting EU expertise in new clean technologies to third countries can benefit the EU economically (83%, EU average 77%).

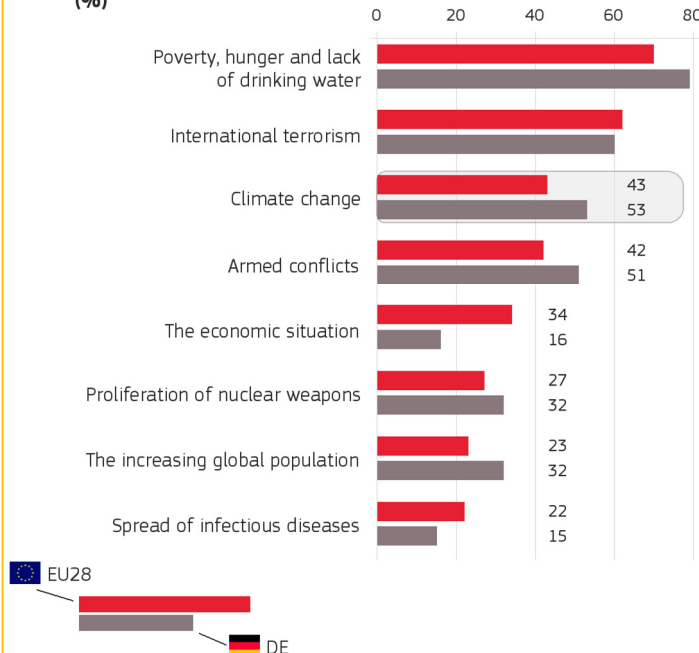
Nearly nine in ten think it is important that their government sets targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used by 2030 (88%, EU average 89%) and provides support for improving energy efficiency by 2030 (86%, EU average 88%).

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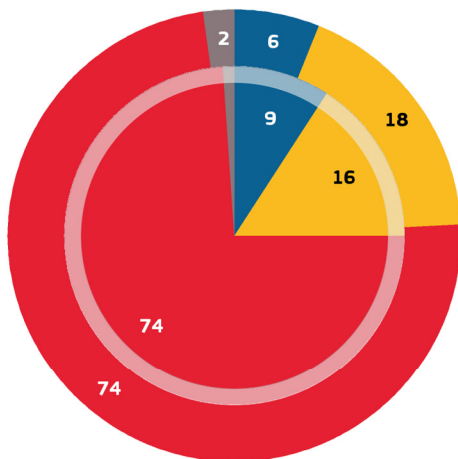

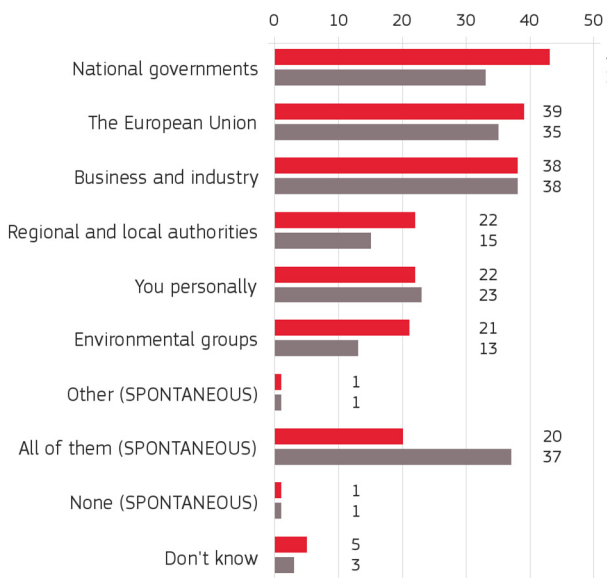

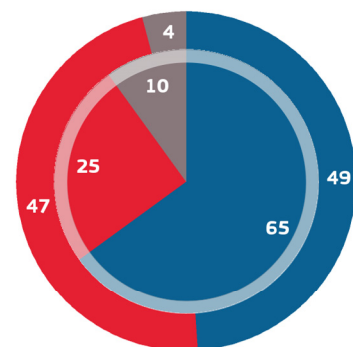

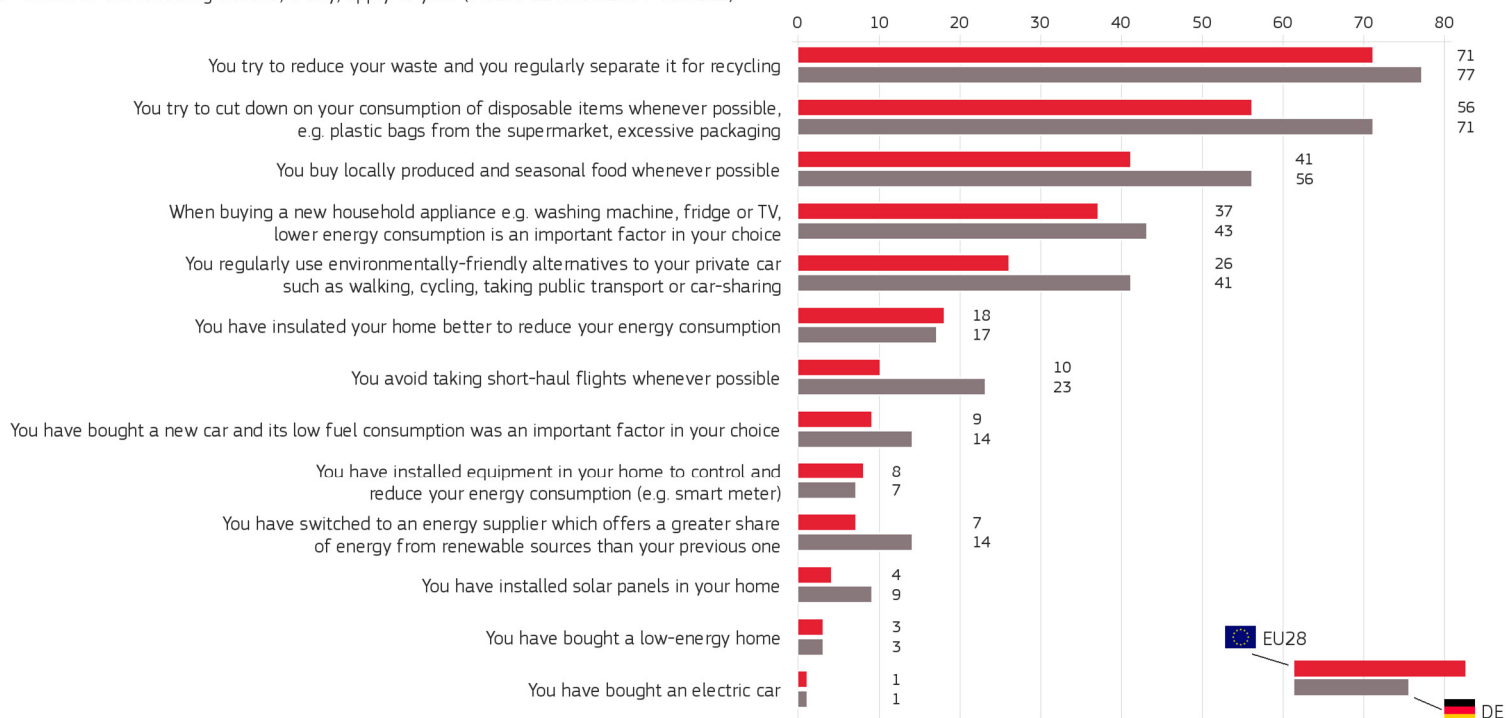

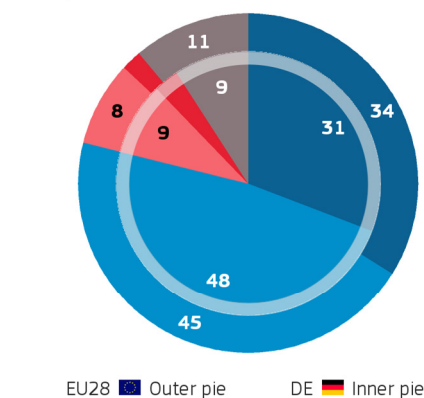
QC6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

Fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (%)

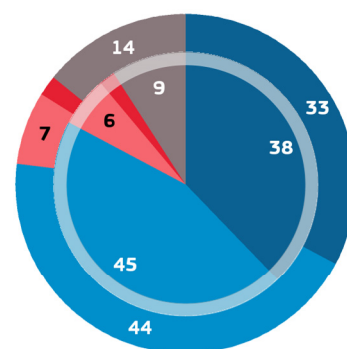

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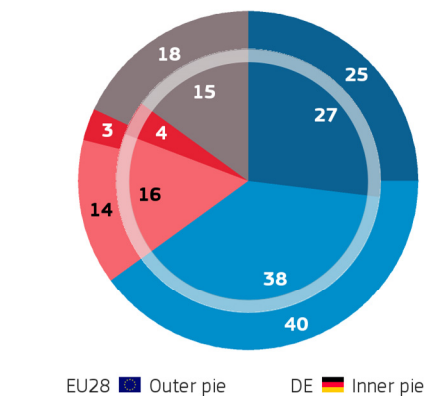

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (%)



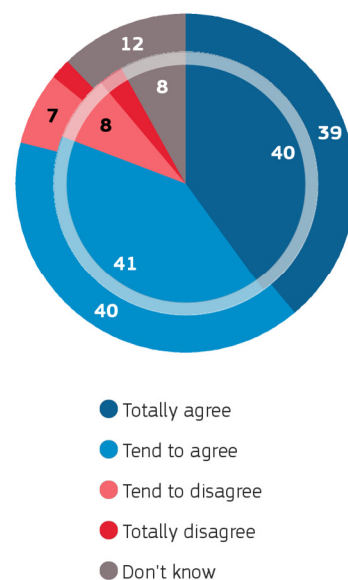

More public financial support should be given to the transition to clean energies even if it means subsidies to fossil fuels should be reduced (%)



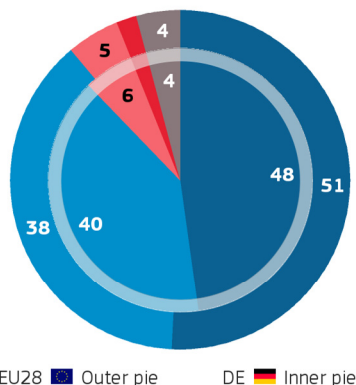

(%)



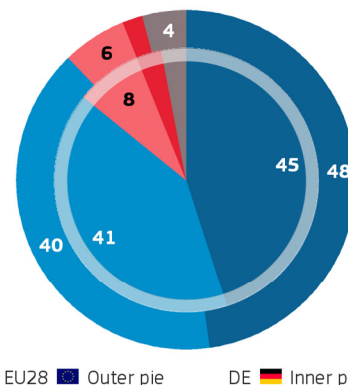
