Methodology: face-to-face

1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Nearly eight in ten respondents in Portugal consider climate change a “very serious problem” (78%, above the EU average of 69%).

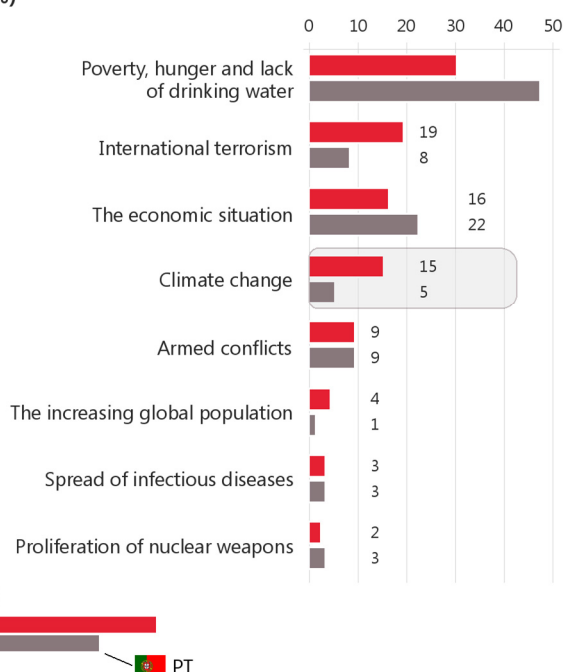
More than half of those surveyed say that they have taken some personal action to fight climate change in the past six months (56%, +3 points since 2013), but this figure rises to 89% when specific actions are listed. The survey revealed:

- 45% buy locally produced food whenever possible (+26 percentage points since 2013)
- 55% try to cut down their consumption of disposable items (+14 percentage points since 2013)
- 67% try to reduce their waste and separate it for recycling (+5 percentage points since 2013)

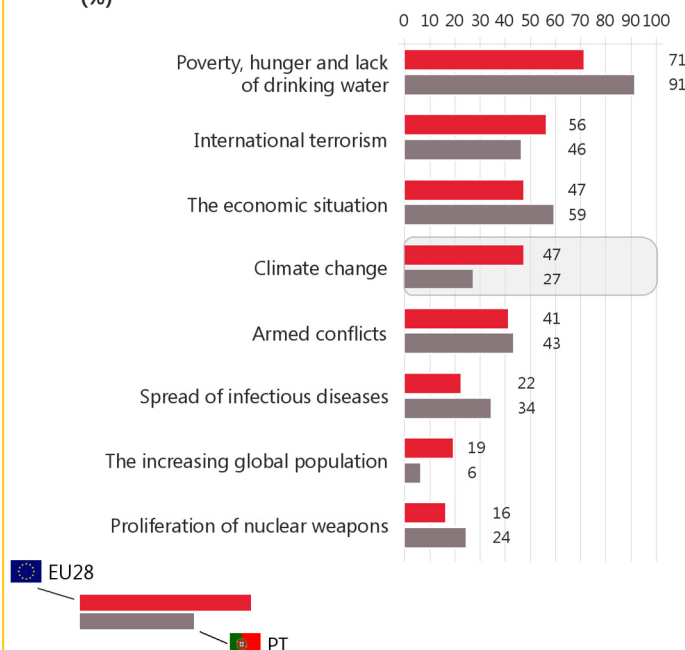
There is a strong consensus that fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and create jobs in the EU (94%, EU average: 81%). A large majority (94%) support national action both to increase the use of renewable energy and improve energy efficiency by 2030. Respondents in Portugal are the most likely to say that reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (84%, well above the EU average of 65%). Some 98% agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.

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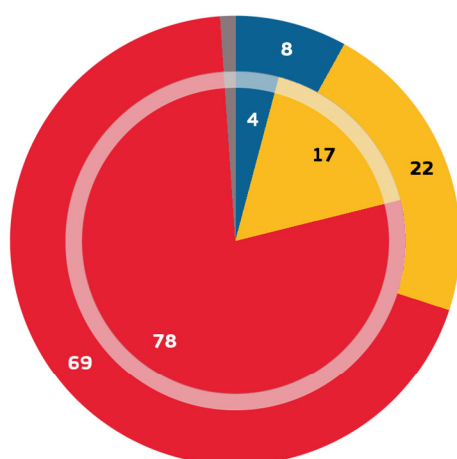

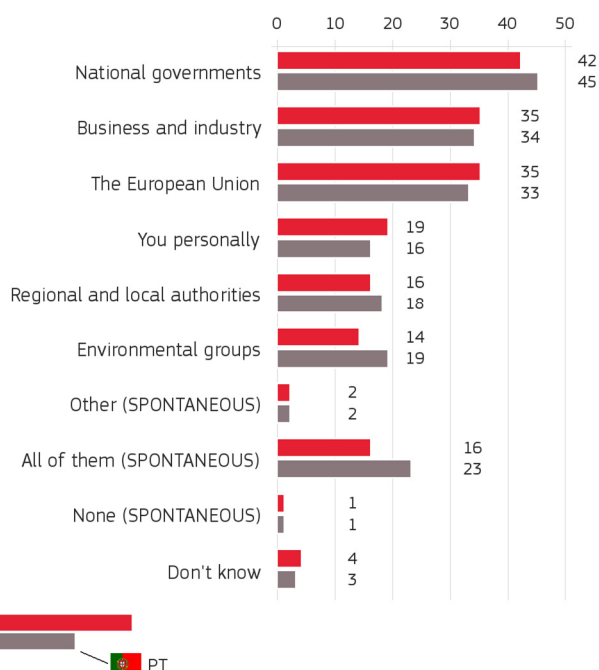

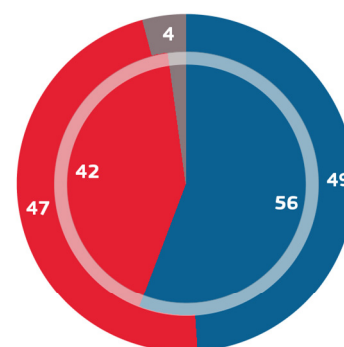
QA3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

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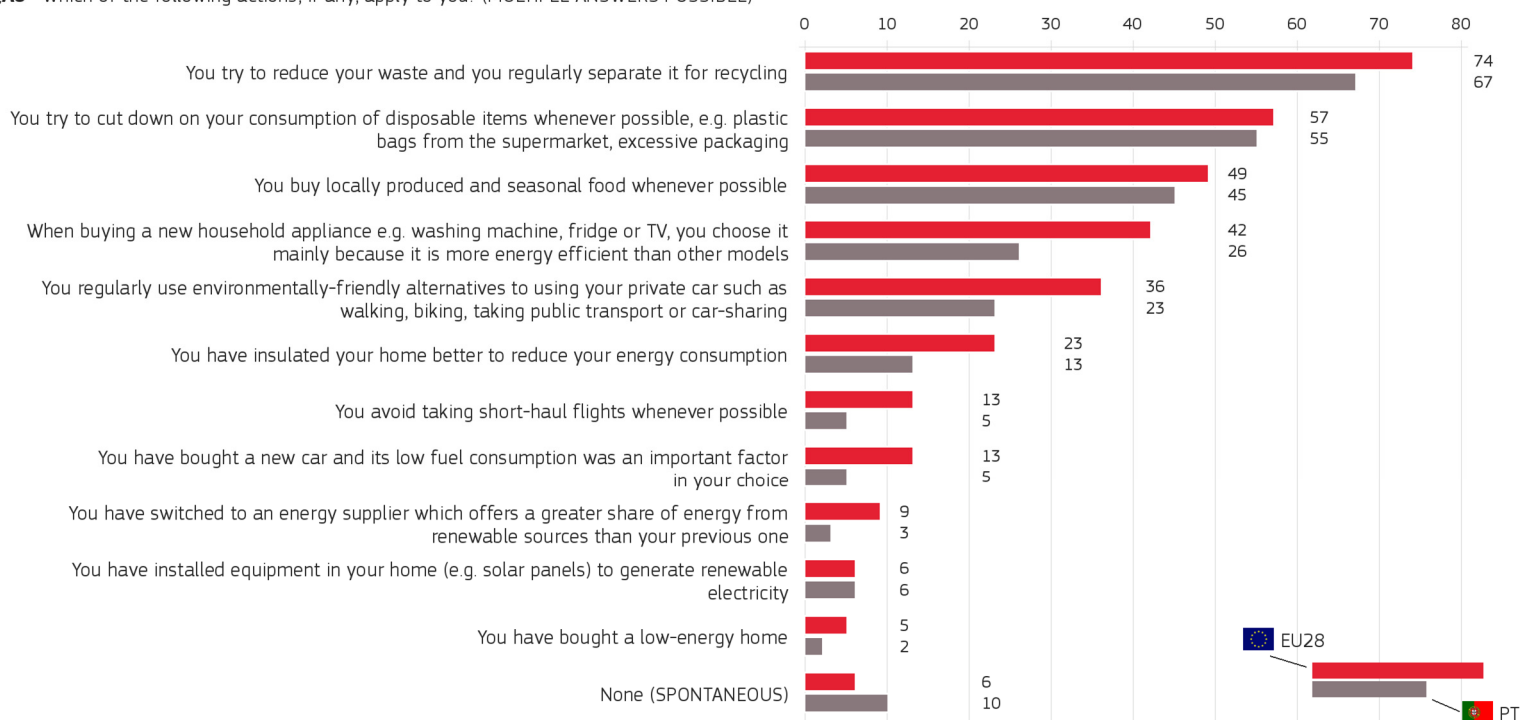

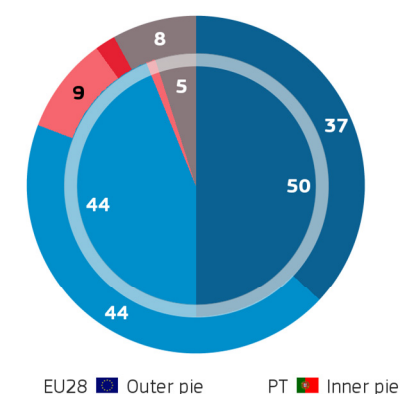
QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

Fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (%)

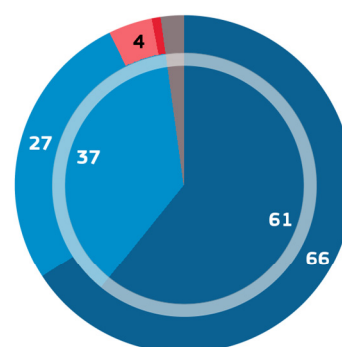

Fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together (%)



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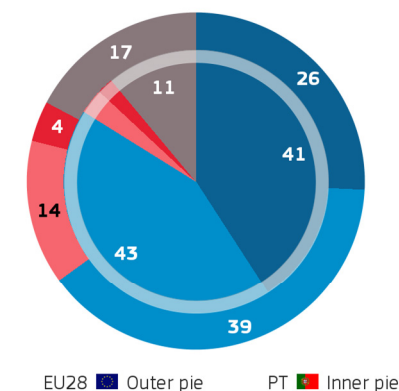

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (%)

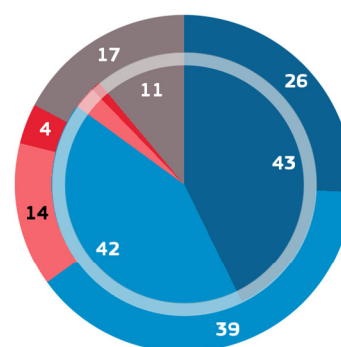

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can increase the security of EU energy supplies (%)

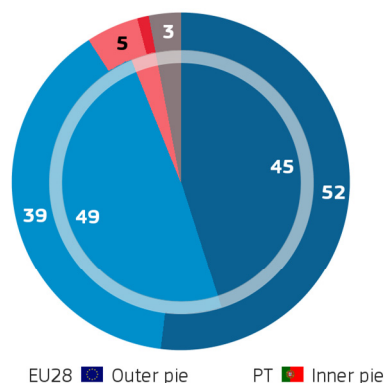

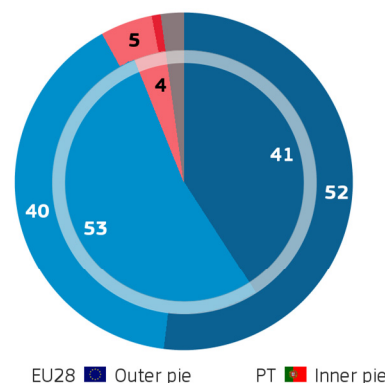
QA7 How important do you think it is that the (NATIONALITY) government sets targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used, such as wind or solar power, by 2030? (%)
