1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Respondents in Sweden are very concerned about climate change. More than three-quarters (76%) consider it to be one of the most serious problems facing the world.

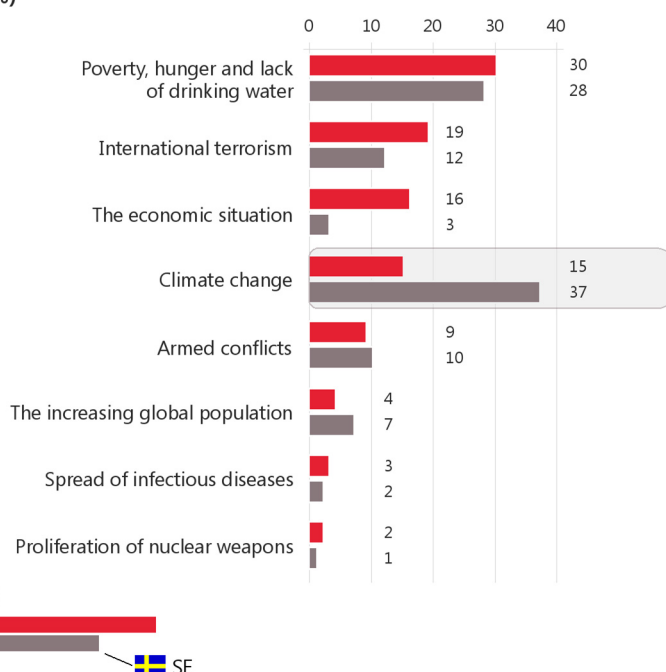
They are also the most likely to take personal action to fight climate change in the past six months (76%, EU average: 49%), although when asked about specific actions 99% reveal they have taken at least one measure:

- Nearly nine in ten (87%) try to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling
- More than two-thirds (67%) try to cut down consumption of disposable items such as plastic bags and excess packaging
- A substantial majority (63%, +10 percentage points since 2013) buy locally produced and seasonal food whenever possible and regularly use environmentally-friendly alternatives to private cars, such as walking, cycling, public transport or car-sharing (62%)
- Almost half (44%) avoid taking short-haul flights whenever possible

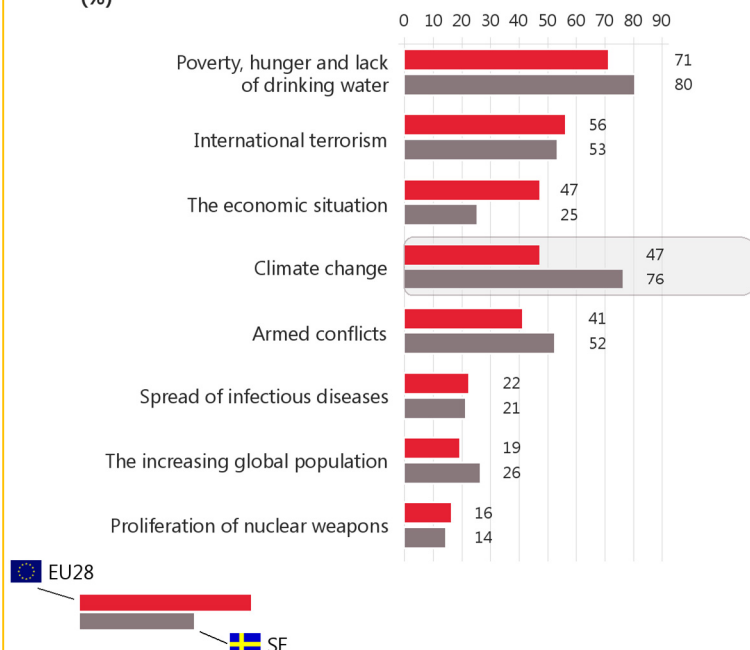
A large majority of respondents in Sweden also believe fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (48% “totally agree” and 43% “tend to agree”). More than nine in ten respondents (93%) agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.

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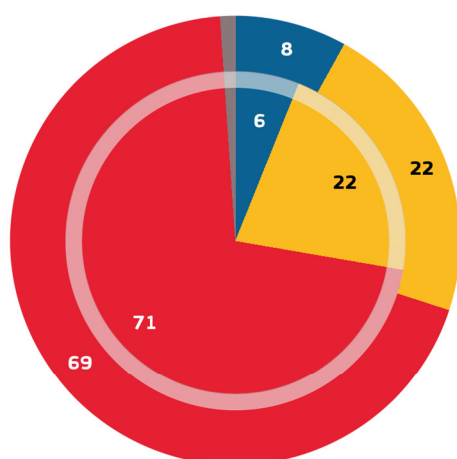

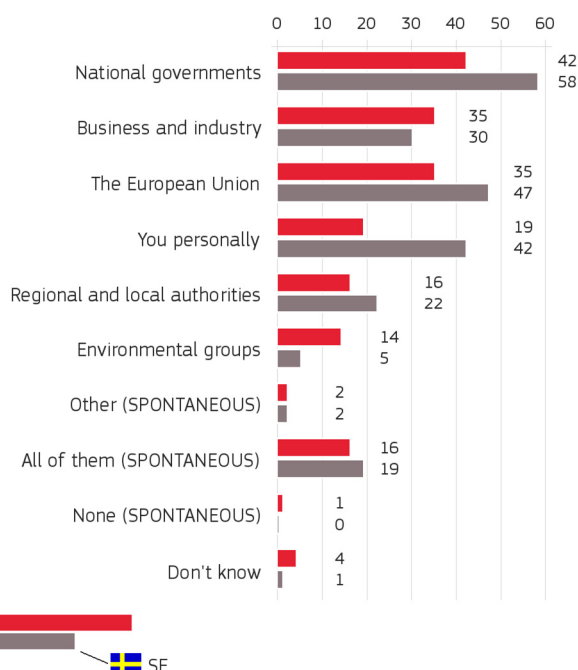

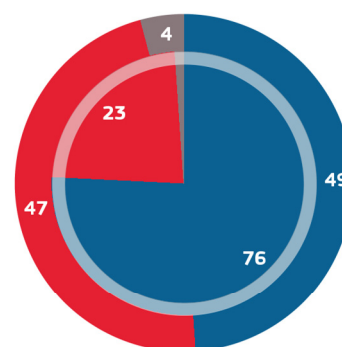
QA3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

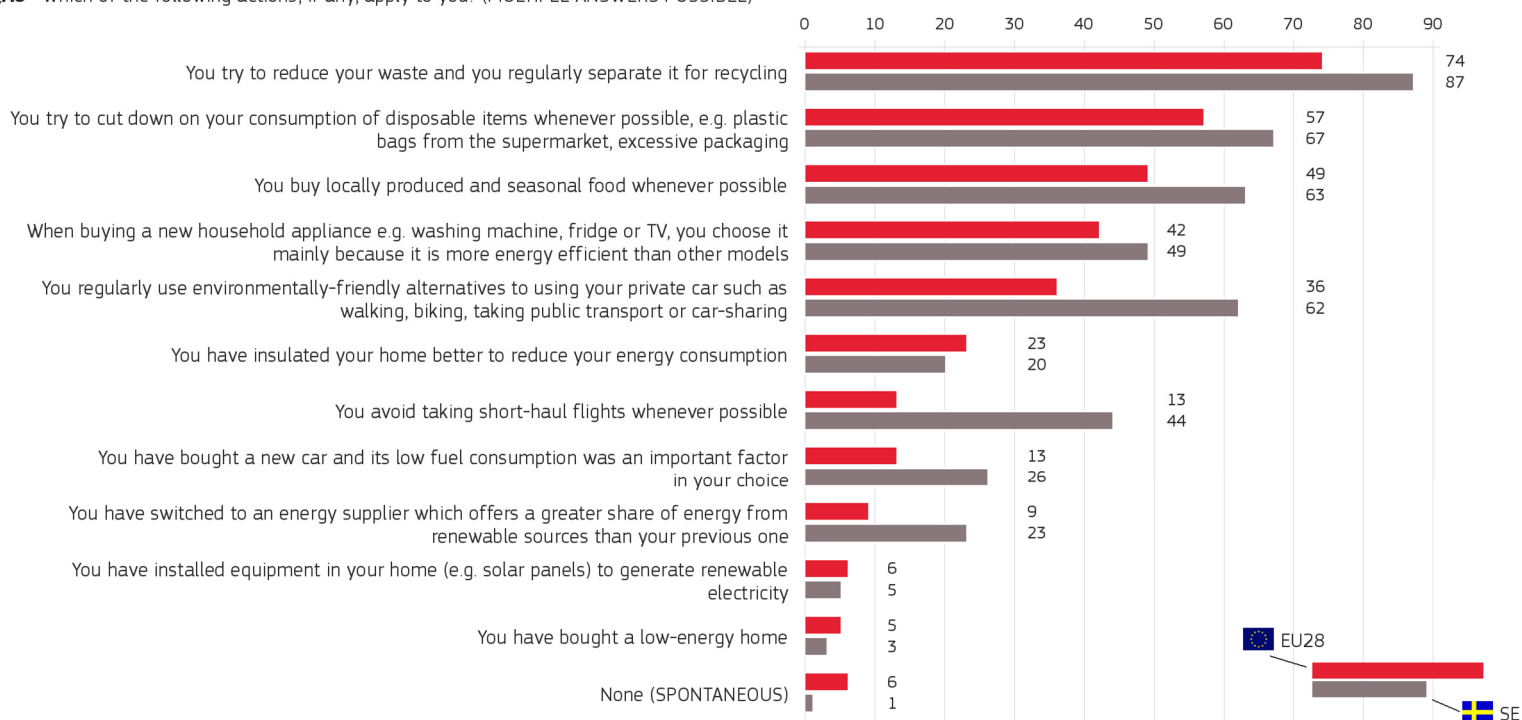

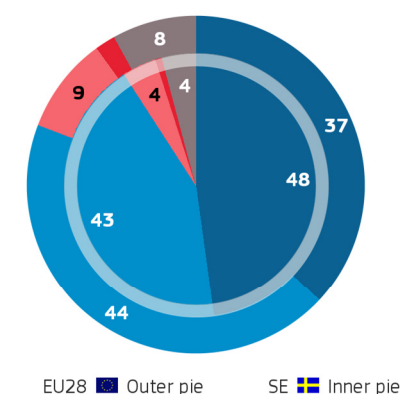
QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

QA4.1 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

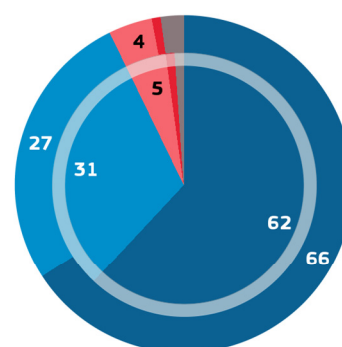
Fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (%)

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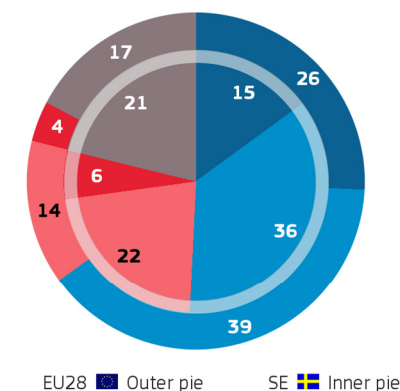

QA4.3 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

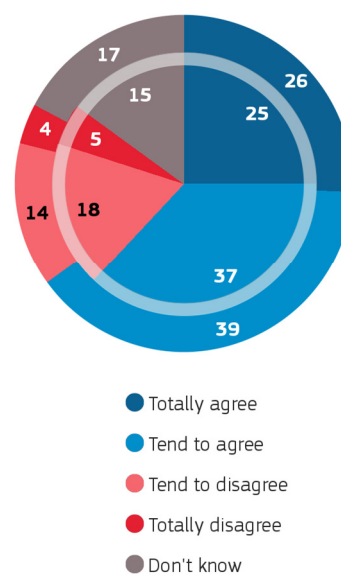
Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (%)

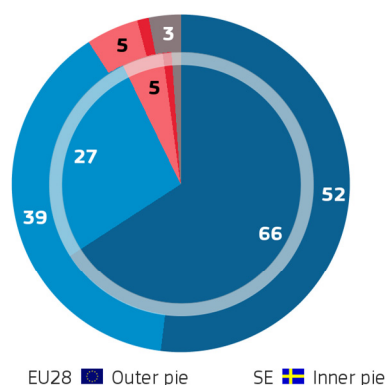
Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can increase the security of EU energy supplies (%)

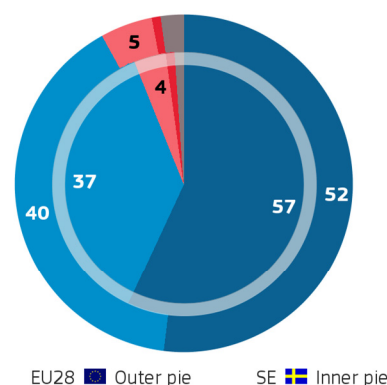
